What must I hear to be saved?

Acts 26:16-18

Introduction

- 1. Philippian jailer's question most important Acts 16:30
- 2. Paul and Silas' response Acts 16:31 Believe on Jesus.
- 3. Paul's reasoning according to the gospel plan Romans 10:14-17 Call on Him, believed, heard, preacher, sent, faith by hearing word of God.
- 4. Paul and Silas' next action Acts 16:32 preached the word of the Lord.
- 5. Important guestion What must I hear to be saved?
 - a. Many conflicting messages exist.
 - b. Only hearing God's word produces faith.
- 6. The sending of Paul to preach what must be heard Acts 26:16-18
- I. Jesus is the Christ, the Son of the Living God
 - A. "To make you a minister and a witness both of the things which you have seen and of the things which I will yet reveal to you"
 - B. Jesus Was Resurrected
 - a. His claim John 5:16-18 equal with God, Son of God.
 - i. John 2:18-22 spoke of resurrection. (More than just here)
 - ii. Matthew 27:62-64 secured tomb because they remembered His words concerning resurrection.
 - b. What Paul witnessed 1 Corinthians 15:3-8 resurrected Lord, born out of due time.
 - c. Declared Son of God Romans 1:4; As the apostles confessed before –
 Matthew 16:16
 - C. Jesus is Lord and Christ
 - a. There are important implications to the proof of His deity, and practical obligations to the ones who believe.
 - b. Peter on Pentecost Acts 2:33-36
 - i. Seated at God's right hand authority, throne, king.
 - ii. Lord and Christ rule which must be submitted to only source of deliverance (Christ Acts 3:24-26)
 - c. Logical/honest response Acts 2:37 what shall we do?
 - i. All who come to the realization of His kingship have the responsibility to submit.
 - ii. Contradiction some claim to believe God raised Him from the dead, but they don't submit to His rule practical unbelief.
- II. Jesus is the Way, the Truth, and the Life
 - A. "To open their eyes in order to turn them from darkness to light"
 - B. To Be in Darkness is to Be Lost
 - a. **John 12:35** does not know where He is going.
 - b. Darkness = sin/ignorance 1 John 1:5 (in God is no darkness)
 - i. 2 Corinthians 6:14 contrast of righteousness/lawlessness, light/darkness.

- ii. **Ephesians 5:11** unfruitful works of darkness.
- c. Eternal separation from God characterized by darkness Matthew 25:30
- C. Jesus Exposes Darkness
 - a. John 1:4-5, 9 bringing life through light to every man.
 - b. **John 3:18-21** must make the choice to turn to the light.
 - c. Jesus is that exclusive light John 14:6
 - i. Absolute objective truth contrary to popular belief.
 - ii. Little darkness is great darkness Matthew 6:22-23
 - iii. Cannot walk in darkness (sin/ignorance) and have salvation 1

 John 1:5-7
- III. Jesus Requires Full Submission
 - A. "and from the power of Satan to God" (power exousia authority)
 - B. Serving One of Two Masters
 - a. Jews exposed to be children of the devil John 8:34, 37-47 not standing in truth rejected Jesus.
 - i. **2 Corinthians 4:3-4** blinded by the god of this age.
 - Satan is the god of this age, the prince of the power of the air –
 Ephesians 2:2-3
 - i. Those who serve this prince disobedient to God, conduct self in lust of flesh.
 - ii. **2 Timothy 2:26** ensnared by the devil, taken captive to do His will.
 - c. Not for Jesus, against Jesus **Matthew 12:30** serving Satan.
 - d. Make self an enemy of God James 4:4
 - C. You Must be Converted
 - a. "to turn them...from the power of Satan to God" turn epistrephō "(2) to change direction, (3) to cause a pers. to change belief or course of conduct, with focus on the thing to which one turns, (4) to change one's mind or course of action, for better or worse" (BDAG)
 - b. Acts 3:19 repent and be converted (same word)
 - i. Repent *metanoeō*; to think differently or afterwards, i.e. reconsider. (Strong)
 - ii. Be converted Changing the mind, and corresponding action over to the authority God.
 - c. Continuing in sin is to continue in slavery to sin Romans 6:16 slave of Satan.
 - d. Jesus requires full change to conform to His will in order to be saved.
- IV. Jesus Offers Forgiveness and Hope
 - A. "that they may receive forgiveness of sins and an inheritance"
 - B. Jesus Came to Save, not Destroy
 - a. Jesus appeared for sin, or on account of sin Hebrews 9:27-28
 - i. To condemn sin by His death Romans 8:3-4
 - ii. Came to save Luke 9:56
 - b. Second appearance apart from sin for salvation:

- i. When salvation comes for some, destruction comes for others 2
 Thessalonians 1:7-10
- ii. Assurance by resurrection Acts 17:30-31 call to repentance.
- c. No atonement w/out blood Hebrews 9:22
- d. Saved/forgiven washed in blood of Jesus Revelation 7:14-15
- e. Baptism Romans 6:3-4 (blood by metonymy for death)
- C. Jesus Offer's Greater Things Than the World
 - a. Those baptized are "born again" John 3:3, 5
 - b. They are given an inheritance 1 Peter 1:3-5 (greater than anything in the world.)
 - c. Gain the world, or lose soul? Mark 8:34-37
- V. Jesus' Offer is Exclusive
 - A. "among those who are sanctified by faith in Me"
 - B. Salvation is Not for the Majority
 - a. Wide way and narrow way Matthew 7:13-14
 - b. Many will say Matthew 7:21-23
 - c. Many called, few chosen Matthew 22:14
 - Reason for intense searching to be found approved of God 2 Timothy
 2:15 are you?
 - C. Only the Sanctified are Saved
 - a. Sanctified set apart.
 - b. Romans 1:16 Gospel saves believers.
 - c. Romans 10:16-17 those who have believed, and obeyed what they heard in the gospel.
 - d. Set apart by faith Christ **Ephesians 1:3; Galatians 3:26-29** baptized into Christ.

Conclusion

- 1. The gospel is that which saves. The gospel is a message that must be heard.
